

# 'Speed beda guru'

The interceptors deployed for curbing speed on the road leading to the airport has the desired impact

The efforts of the police to curb the 'speed devils' on NH-7 leading to the Bengaluru International Airport (BIA) seem to have had the right effect.

to the airport.

"You can't go beyond 80 kmph 'guru'. The moment you cross that barrier, you will be caught and fined," Ravikrishna, the driver of a private taxi, was found telling his friends.

Ramesh Kumar, another driver at one of the government departments at Vikas Soudha, said: "You cannot escape from these equipment. No matter at what speed you drive, you are in a fix once you cross the speed limit."
